

# **SOLIDARITY SOCCER DATA PRIVACY NOTICE**

## What information is being collected?

The information we are collecting includes:

- Name
- Address including post code
- Date of Birth/Age
- Email
- Gender
- Ethnicity
- Disability
- Solidarity Soccer attendance
- Relevant medical information including allergies/injury problems (see physical activity readiness questionnaire)
- We indirectly collect and process the contact details of your emergency contact, including their name, relationship to yourself and phone number
- Consent in the event of any illness/accident, any necessary treatment can be administered, which may include the use of anaesthetics
- Imagery and video permission
- Where you heard about Solidarity Soccer
- Whether you are interested in playing 11-a-side football
- Accident and incident reports are done where relevant
- We will send out regular surveys asking for your feedback on Solidarity Soccer
- We produce case studies with some participants about their experiences at Solidarity Soccer depending on consent

## Who is collecting it?

AFC Unity are collecting and processing this information.

#### How is it collected?

We collect this information via you completing our "Expression of Interest" form. This is often completed digitally, but if it is completed as a hard copy it will become digitised with the hard copy being shredded.

We categorise this data to create an attendance register of people that come to the Solidarity Soccer sessions and provide an easy to use document, especially in case of emergencies, e.g. medical contact information.

The data will be deleted every May, with everyone wanting to continue to take part in Solidarity Soccer having to complete a new form.

We will send out surveys by email asking for your feedback on the session via Survey Monkey.

We will summarise the data before deleting for funding and evaluation purposes, making sure all data is unidentifiable and anonymised. As an exception, we will keep copies of image release forms and data protection consent forms but make sure these are password protected – you can withdraw your consent at any time by contacting us via the details included below within the "Data Controller" section.

Whilst trade union discounts are available via the club, we do not record trade union status for attendees of Solidarity Soccer.

For case studies, we will email you to ask if you want to answer several questions via email to produce a case study to illustrate the impact of Solidarity Soccer, which will then be compiled into an article that will be displayed online on our website, and potentially summarised as quotes via images that will be shared on social media.

#### How will it be used?

We collect and process this data for several reasons, including:

For some of your personal information you will have a legal, contractual or other requirement or obligation for you to provide us with your personal information. If you do not provide us with the requested personal information we may not be able to admit you as an AFC Unity Solidarity Soccer participant or we may not be able to comply with legal obligations and we may have to stop you from attending Solidarity Soccer. For other personal information you may not be under an obligation to provide it to us, but if you do not provide it then it may affect our service provision.

Where you have given us your consent to use your personal information in a particular manner, you have the right to withdraw this consent at any time, which you may do by contacting us as described in the "Data Controller" section below.

Please note however that the withdrawal of your consent will not affect any use of the data made before you withdrew your consent and we may still be entitled to hold and process the relevant personal information to the extent that we are entitled to do so on bases other than your consent. Withdrawing consent may also have the same effects as not providing the information in the first place.

### Who will it be shared with?

AFC Unity may share the data with the following groups/people/organisations:

- AFC Unity's 11-a-side players who become AFC Unity Ambassador Coaches
- AFC Unity's Board of Directors
- AFC Unity's volunteers
- Funders of AFC Unity
- U-Mix Centre

Anyone using this data will be asked to sign a contract agreeing to destroy the data in May or when they are no longer involved, whichever is soonest.

#### **Retention Period**

The data will be deleted every year in May, with anyone wanting to continue to take part in Solidarity Soccer needing to complete a new Expression of Interest form.

We will summarise the data before deleting for funding and evaluation purposes, making sure all data is unidentifiable and anonymised. As an exception, we will keep copies of image release forms and data protection consent forms but make sure these are password protected – you can withdraw your consent at any time by contacting us via the details included below within the "Data Controller" section.

Case studies will remain online on our website and shared via social media unless you ask for it to be removed.
